

When it's time to un-deck the halls, know how to dispose of your tree.



Remove all decorations including lights, tinsel, wire and ornaments.

Decide which disposal method works best for you:

Drop-off at:

Central Transfer and Recycling: 111034 NE 117th Ave. \$

West Van Materials Recovery: 16601 NW Lower River Road \$

City Bark: 12419 NE Andresen Road \$

H&H Wood Recyclers: 18401 NE 117th Ave. \$

McFarlane's Bark: 38806 NE 117th Ave. \$

Triangle Resources: 5612 SE Union St. in Camas \$

Set out your tree, cut into sections up to 5 feet in length, inside or next to your yard debris cart* (even if it's empty) on your curbside yard debris pick-up day. **An extra fee will be applied if the tree is in addition to a full yard debris cart.** \$

Set out your tree for recycling by the Boy Scouts of America on the first Saturday in January. Fliers with tree pick-up information will be distributed in neighborhoods where this service is available. **This service is free, with a suggested donation.**

Set out your tree, cut into sections up to 5 feet in length, next to your garbage cart on your curbside garbage pick-up day. Trees will be sent to the landfill. \$

Reduce the amount of waste you send to the landfill! Recycle your natural tree with your yard debris service, the Boy Scouts, or at any of the drop-off locations listed above. Donate decorations in good condition to a charitable thrift store. Find stores at ClarkGreenNeighbors.org.
