### Lifting the Lid: Improving Recycling One Cart at a Time

Educators have been lifting the lids of curbside carts to set the community up for success!

The cart tagging program helps residents recycle right. This program provides helpful and customized feedback when contamination (items not accepted for recycling) is observed in the recycle cart. On collection day, Recycling Advocates with Waste Connections lift cart lids to check for items that do not belong. When they see unaccepted items, an "Oops Tag" is hung on the cart to provide education and feedback to residents. The program has been active throughout the county for over a decade.

Repeat visits demonstrate more customers recycle right. Garbage found in the recycling has dropped by **50%!** 

The program empowers residents to take action and keep garbage out of the recycling system.

### **How Do I Recycle Plastics?**

Plastic recycling in Clark County depends on the item's size, shape and rigidity.

Items which meet **ALL** of the following guidelines are recyclable:



- ✓ SIZE: Larger than the size of your fist and smaller than five gallons.
- ✓ **SHAPE:** Bottles, tubs, jugs and jars.
- ✓ RIGID: Plastics that hold their shape under pressure.

### **Glass Recycling**



Only recycle **bottles and jars that once held food or liquid.** 


Glass must be loose in the glass recycle cart. No plastic bags, paper drink carriers or paper bags.

**NO:** light bulbs, candles, broken glass, canning jars, drinking glasses, ceramics, windows, mirrors, tabletop glass, aquarium glass or bottles with fruit slices, lids or corks.



# Don't Put Recycling in Plastic Bags



- Set out at the curb by 6:00 AM.
- Recyclables should be empty, clean and dry.

- No broken glass or objects that are sharp or heavy.
- When in doubt, leave it out!

### **Curbside Motor Oil, Antifreeze and Batteries**

#### **Motor Oil and Antifreeze**

**YES:** Pour used motor oil or antifreeze into a clear, 1-gallon plastic jug with a screw-top lid. No other containers are accepted.

Label jug with "motor oil" or "antifreeze."

Place on the ground next to your recycle cart.

**NO:** Mixing motor oil or antifreeze with each other or any other liquid.



#### **Household Batteries**

**YES:** Used Alkaline and rechargeable AA, AAA, C, D, button cell, 9 volt and other similar sized batteries.

Tape the ends and put in a sealed, clear plastic bag.

Place on top of your recycle cart.

**NO:** Lithium-ion batteries (i.e., batteries from cell phones, laptops, tablets, electronics, power tools).



# Household **Hazardous Waste**

To identify Household Hazardous Waste (HHW), look for words on the product label such as caution, warning, danger, explosive, flammable, toxic or poison.



HHW should **NEVER** be thrown in the trash or poured down the drain because it can pose threats to public health and the environment.

#### **Sharps**

**FREE** Sharps include hypodermic needles, syringes or intravenous (IV) tubing with needles attached, scalpel blades and lancets.

Place the items into an approved sharps disposal container or other sturdy plastic container with the lid screwed on. Drop off at the transfer station.



#### Medications

**FREE** Learn more about safe and convenient disposal for expired, unused or unwanted medications. Look up disposal locations and mail-back options at

#### **Electronics**

**FREE** With the E-Cycle Washington program, it's easy to recycle certain broken, obsolete or worn-out electronics:

- -Televisions
- -Tablets
- -Computers
- -E-readers
- -Laptops
- -Portable DVD players
- -Monitors

**FREE** Recycle paint by dropping off at local stores – look up locations on paintcare.org

#### **Extras**

Not enough space in your container? Find out more at wcnorthwest.com/extras

Garbage

Put in a 32-gallon can or in a securely fastened

garbage bag. Charges apply.

**Recycling** Put items loose in a 32-gallon can, cardboard

box or paper bag. No charge.

NO: Extra recycling in plastic bags.

Yard Debris/ Put in a 32-gallon can, kraft paper bag or tie

in a bundle. Charges apply.

**Organics** NO: Extra yard debris in plastic bags.



#### **Holiday Service**

There is no service on Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years Day. Collection will be delayed one day.

### **Postponed/Canceled Service**

If service is canceled, we will reschedule or pick up a double load on your next service day. How to prepare:

- Make sure we have your current phone number. Contact Waste Connections customer service to update.
- Sign up for service alerts through the RecycleRight app or wcnorthwest.com/servicealert

**Please note:** Our automated phone message cannot reach you if your phone number is on the National Do Not Call Registry.

# **Yard Debris and Organics**

Reduce how much waste is ending up at the landfill by keeping yard debris and organic waste out of the garbage. Yard debris and food waste is turned into nutrient-rich compost which is important to build healthy soil. By using yard debris or organics service, you may even save money by reducing garbage cart size or frequency of collection!



Don't toss leftover Halloween pumpkins in the garbage - carved and uncarved pumpkins are accepted in yard debris and organics carts!

\*Please remove glitter, paint, candles and all plastic from pumpkins.
